HOW DO YOUR GIFTS BENEFIT THE MUSEUM?

The museum provides a space to appreciate the history of the Packard family, Packard Motor Car Company, and Packard Electric through the exhibition of automobiles and memorabilia. Types of Gifts

Determining Value

- Object values are determined by the market value for the date given
- Automobiles and other expensive objects should be evaluated and appraised by an knowledgeable individual. The value determined will act as the tax basis for the gift. Though the museum may be able to suggest an appraiser, the museum cannot appraise the gift.

Tax Information

- The National Packard Museum is a public charity 501(c) (3) tax exempt organization under the rulings of the Internal Revenue Service.
- All donations receive an accompanying letter with the tax information for easy deductibility
